Be an EuroEntrepreneur further referred as **BEE** project aims to familiarize youngsters with the concept of social entrepreneurship and business opportunities. The **BEE** Youth Exchange is an international event created based on the partnership among 7 organizations from 7 EU countries (Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Italy, Latvia, Poland and Romania), taking place between **1 – 11 April 2022** in Vatra Dornei, a popular mountain resort in the North Carpathians of Romania. The **BEE** Youth Exchange involves 45 participants, whom thought nonformal learning methods are encouraged to turn their ideas into actions using the “Business Model Canvas” as a business analysis tool and social entrepreneurship innovations. The national teams are formed of a total of 6 people, 5 youngsters and 1 leader.

The activities are designed to foster to the participating youngsters during 11 days with business techniques to encourage development of local economy, creating an inclusive labour market. Through this project, Association Geo Club wants to address the issue of youth unemployment and lack of inclusion in the labour markets, encouraging youngsters through sharing of methods and opportunities for entrepreneurship to develop their business ideas.

The project is financed through Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union.

Participants

Participants of BEE are youngsters from Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Italy, Latvia, Poland and Romania aged 18-30. The activities of the project are accessible to every participant as nonformal learning methods are used. The project topic is entrepreneurship. Participants being highly involved in activities that require imagination and creativity and are encouraged and stimulated to transform their ideas into actions. Selected participants are expected to participate in all the activities of the BEE Youth Exchange.



Working language of this youth exchange is English.

Your English doesn't need to be perfect, neither is ours! Better a little English than no any language communication at all.

It's important to respect and understand each other!

Each team leader is required to be aged 18 with no upper age limit.



Eligible youngsters for the participation in BEE activities are:

- aged 18-30;
- residents of Bulgaria/Croatia/Estonia/Italy/Latvia/Poland/Romania;
- interested in the topic of the project;
- are available to travel to Romania and participate in all the activities of the BEE Youth Exchange;
- are keen to be involved in the activities of all the phases of the project;
- are interested in other cultures and nationalities;
- are open minded and curious;
- want to acquire and develop new skills, attitudes and behaviours;
- are interested in nonformal learning methods;
- have at least beginners' level in English as all communication is carried out in English;
- are part of vulnerable groups;
- are facing social, economic, educational or geographical obstacles.

Do NOT forget your necessary documents to enter Romania!

The citizens of **Bulgaria, Croatia, Estonia, Italy, Latvia** and **Poland** can enter Romania with only their **valid ID Card (National Card)** as the countries are part of the **European Union**. BUT it's the responsibility of each participant to check, recheck and double check its own travel condition(s) to Romania, from the starting departure point all the way to the final arrival destination!

Accommodation and food: 100% covered by Erasmus + Program

Important!

No tickets are allowed to be bought before confirming it with organizers.

Please use the cheapest possible means of transportation - second class. If you will use train and/or the bus as well, please use the second class, this is very important.

Keep all your boarding passes and travelling tickets otherwise we will not be able to make any reimbursement! Only public transportation will be reimbursed (e. g.: taxi at your own expense).



For Bulgaria the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 180€



For Italy the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 275€



For Croatia the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 275€



For Latvia the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 275€



For Estonia the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 275€



For Poland the reimbursement limit for transportation is: 275€

Travel tips and meeting info

You will arrive in **Cluj-Napoca** (or simply **Cluj**, as most Romanians prefer to call it) at the Avram Iancu Airport (CLJ). It is the only airport in the city of Cluj-Napoca and the biggest one in Transylvania:

Please try to book flights directly from the website of the airlines, **FLEXIBLE** as it can be easier to make changes or request a refund in case of unpredictable flight disruptions due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

It is mandatory for your flight tickets to be "**Flexible**", this means to be free of charge in case we/you will have to change the dates of the flight(s)!



Arrival and departure

The arrival day to Cluj-Napoca is **the 1st of April 2022, maximum at 9 PM!**

If for some reason you cannot find tickets with morning or after-noon arrival time please email us and we will find a solution for you!

We will depart back to Cluj-Napoca on 10th of April around midnight, so make sure you have flights that leave not earlier than **6:00 a.m. on 11th April 2022.**

You can also stay in Cluj-Napoca 1-2 days before or after the Youth Exchange to visit, at your own expense.

To get to the city centre you will use public transport. Bus line 5 of the local public transit system CTP Cluj-Napoca runs between the airport and the city of Cluj-Napoca. The trolleybus departs approximately every 10 minutes between 05:00 a.m. and 22:00 p.m., on weekends and evenings every 15 to 20 minutes.

Important!

Romania is not part of the Euro Zone and our currency is **the Romanian Leu (RON)**. You can exchange money in exchange offices, banks and kiosks.
1 EUR = 4.94 RON (AUGUST 2021)

The airport bus stop is located 200 metres from the terminal, along the 'Strada Traian Vuia'. It is a short walk from the terminal, you first have to go to the main road and then to the right. In the centre of Cluj-Napoca, you can get off at the stops Constanta (Regionale CFR), Sora and Central. The bus ride to one of these bus stops in the centre of Cluj-Napoca takes an average of 25 minutes. The first and final stop of bus line 5 is known as Fierul and can be found in the street 'Strada Cuza Voda'. Tickets are available at vending machines and service counters near the bus stops.

As additional advice, don't change too much money inside the airport because of the bad rates compared to the exchange offices downtown (we recommend 5-10 euro maximum). If you choose to take a taxi, it will be your own expense because taxi fares are not refunded in our project, having available public transport.

Reimbursement Procedure

The travel costs will be reimbursed in the partner organization account after the mobility and dissemination (local actions) made by participants, based on the proof documents provided by the participants.

To speed up the reimbursement process, as soon as participants book their flights, **will upload** the following documents on the G-drive folder (dedicated for this project): *Invoice*, *Proof of payment* (Bank extras), and the *boarding pass* during the mobility (electronic version) and after the mobility (printed version).

For the reimbursement you need:

- An invoice for the tickets
- Non-online purchases: a receipt (showing that you have paid the money) – only for train and bus tickets
- Document showing that the money was paid (receipt, bank confirmation etc.)

For the airplane tickets:

- Flight ticket (with the name of the passenger and flight details)
- All boarding passes
- Confirmation of reservation

Important!

No tickets are allowed to be bought before being confirmed by the organizers.

Please, make sure that you have all these documents when you come to the Youth Exchange (of course, the return boarding passes might be sent after the Youth Exchange).



Please DO NOT lose your boarding passes, train tickets, and/or bus tickets. We will not be able to make the reimbursement anymore if you lose them.

We encourage you to find flights which allow online check-in and also, we recommend you to use the mobile check-in (when possible), as this way you can save a copy of your boarding passes easily and thus you can even make a print screen of the document and store it in a safe folder on your phone/cloud etc.

Reimbursement will be done by **bank transfer ONLY** in the account of your sending organization, according to the rules of Erasmus+ and our National Agency.

Although we can't reimburse you the cost of **health insurance**, having one that is valid during all periods of mobility is mandatory! Romania is an EU member state, so insurance for traveling here should be cheap and easy to make. If you have a European Health Card, please bring it with you, it is valid in our hospital system and can replace regular insurance.

COVID 19 RULES

WE STRONGLY ENCOURAGE OUR PARTNERS TO SELECT ONLY PARTICIPANTS WHO HAVE BEEN VACCINATED AGAINST COVID- 19! Entering the country with the EU Digital COVID certificate [EU Digital Covid Certificate](#) !

Geo Club will follow, during the youth exchange the Health Protocol regarding the security and protection of all the participants and staff. The protection and security measures will be in accordance with the legislation in force at the time of the face-to-face activity, always considering the indications of the Romanian Ministry of Health, indications of accommodation and transport (international and national).

Previous to the project: As a European travel rule, the travel of any participant who presents Covid-19 symptoms prior to the trip to Romania is strictly forbidden. Each partner has the responsibility to check before the departure the rules and restrictions imposed for their country by the Romanian Ministry of Health.

As of now, in Romania, there is no quarantine or lockdown in place. Only a few mild restrictions are still present, such as wearing a mask in public indoor spaces (markets, malls, public transportation).

The applied measures are subject to change and regular review. Travellers are advised to consult the measures in force at the time of their planned trip and have the [EU Digital Covid Certificate](#)

Covid-19 Vaccination Certificate & PCR tests & Health Insurance:

The participants selected to attend the international mobility acknowledge and agree to have **valid health insurance** for the whole duration of the project and the [EU Digital Covid Certificate](#)

Travel: During international & national travel, it is important to respect the security measures imposed by airlines, airports and various transportation companies, with regard to a safe distance and the use of a protective mask.

During the project: Please proceed according to the accommodation and host organization safety standards, which are imposed by WHO, European Commission, and Ministry of Health. It is mandatory to use a medical mask (not a textile one).

Attention!

In accordance with the Emergency Ordinance no. 1190 / 15.12.2021, amended and supplemented by Emergency Ordinance no. 5 published no. 117 / 04.02.2022, starting with December 20, 2021, persons entering Romania must complete the **Digital Entry Form (PLF)**, a document adopted at the level of 18 states in the European Union.

The form must be completed no later than 72 hours before entering Romania or within 24 hours of crossing the border.

What to bring?

Comfortable/casual clothing

Make sure to bring comfortable clothes. During April the weather in Romania will generally be warm, though at night it can get quite chilly. You will need some cosy clothes but also something to keep you warm in case the temperature gets lower than expected. The average temperature in the north of Romania in April is usually 15 degrees Celsius during the daytime and can get to 5 degrees Celsius at night. Don't forget to bring slippers for shower, towels, and personal hygiene and cosmetic products.

Laptops


We encourage you to bring laptops as we will need several ones to work on the final outcome of the Youth Exchange.

Participants are expected to make a little bit of **research**, prior to their arrival, on their local community and to look into the **opportunities and challenges for entrepreneurship** in their countries. Each national group will present at the beginning of the Youth Exchange the research to all of the participants. For this you may use 1-2 news/research articles or national reports from your country about **entrepreneurship**. Please make a short summary also in English. We will be using this information in debates on how is your country encouraging entrepreneurship as well as positive and negative aspects.

Presentation of your country and organisation: Please be prepared to present your country and sending organisation during the youth exchange. Bring some **informational materials about your country and sending organisation** and other things such as traditional food and drinks as well traditional clothing, trinkets and other objects which you see fit as to help you in your presentation for the other participants.
