- acting to create a network of contacts involving the associations and productive realities on the local, national and international territory to encourage cooperation in beneficial and constructive initiatives at all levels.


Objectives:

- 1. The promotion of paths of territorial animation and cultural autonomy of places
- 2. The protection and promotion of local traditions and typical products
- 3. Protection of the environment and raising awareness of eco-sustainability
- 4. Enhancement of the historical and artistic heritage of the territory
- 5. The rediscovery of nature trails and craft practices
- 6. Training for active citizenship and employability
- 7. Integration of refugees and marginalised people in general

SUMMARY OF THE PROJECT:

The fairy tale represents a universal narrative genre that can be found in the oral tradition of each people and group and that is handed down from one generation to another, gradually changing and adapting to changes in time and space. Through fairy tales we can then discover the characteristics and differences that characterize a group, a country, a way of life; enter for a moment through the suggestion and magic of the word narrated in the daily life of a village, a land and a people.

Fairy tales remind us of the countless analogies and similarities between distant contexts, places, environments. The good and the bad, the trials and the hero, the princess and the evil spirits, the stages of life and growth: these are motifs and themes present in the narratives here and elsewhere. They constitute the weft and the



warp of stories that have "travelled" through the world and have coloured themselves, here and there, with nuances, references, chiaroscuros drawn on the way. The path of the imaginary is therefore a path of many links; ancient contaminations overlap, among myths, legends and fairy tales and changes that follow the evolution of the culture in which it originates and of which it feeds. The story and oral tradition enclose a network of deep meanings through which man interprets and explains the world, its laws, organization and social life, the why of all things and all living beings. Even in the extreme variety and richness of languages, situations, environments, events that characterize the fairy tales of all countries, the collective imagination leads back each time to the essential discoveries about the human condition, life and death, friendship and love, fear and desires. The imaginary therefore has the power to unite peoples and cultures transversally and, at the same time, to tell about their specificity.

Discovering and rediscovering together the fairy tales of here and elsewhere becomes an instrument of comparison and knowledge between different cultural traditions, worlds and peoples. To immerse and let kids freely immerse themselves in the fantasy world, offering the widest repertoire of fairy tales everywhere, can be a way to recreate a "dive" into the collective imagination and let it act with its own forces of enchantment, potential, possibilities...

OBJECTIVES:

- To know and recognize other contexts and ways of living
- Trace, through fairy tales, similarities and differences, commonalities and specificities
- Enhance different alphabets, languages and scriptures
- Stimulating positive attitudes and curiosity towards each other and other cultures
- Increasing the willingness to welcome and democratic coexistence
- Overcoming compassionate attitudes towards distant countries
- Stimulate motivation to read by bringing out the pleasure of reading



PROFILE OF PARTICIPANTS:

Age range 18 to 25 years. Young people from rural areas with geographical obstacles, economic difficulties and/or learning difficulties. In addition, young people who have all-round artistic inclinations, who love photography, literature and history.

Each group must consist of 5 young people + 1 group leader (no age limit).

All participants will receive a YOUTH PASS at the end of the mobility action.









VENUE SANT' AGATA DEI GOTI:

Sant'Agata is located in a rural area of southern Campania. It is a small town of about 11,000 inhabitants, with a charming natural setting but which can be limiting for young people. Let's Tell promotes peer-to-peer encounters, demonstrating how it is possible to actively engage in social change, including through cultural and social cultural and social promotion, and in a context of mutual trust and intercultural respect. The main message in telling their stories and opening up to their peers will be to show that social transformation can be a slow process, but possible with the using the right methods; here are the ones mainly used in this project: non-formal education, community building and non-violent communication.



TRAVELLING:

The nearest airport is Capodichino in Naples.

The nearest railway station is Caserta.

Once arrived at this airport or station you will find our shuttles that will take you to our small village.

N.B.: Other airports and/or arrival stations are not covered by the grant.

Costs related to travel in Italy (Napoli airport/Caserta station-Sant'Agata) and those related to food and accommodation, visa are entirely covered by the host organisation.

Travel costs are refundable for participants who attend all the sessions, commit themselves fully to the activities of the project. Travel expenses will be covered after collecting travel documents on condition that the participants use the cheapest ways of transportation and submitted original invoices for plane tickets, boarding passes, train and bus tickets. Private cars, Taxi and first-class tickets will not be reimbursed! Please book the cheapest mean of transport.

PLEASE MAKE SURE TO BOOK YOUR FLIGHT WITH CANCELATION INSURANCE in case we are forced to cancel or postpone the activity due to new measures or lockdowns.

Please keep also ALL other travelling documents you have. Don't throw anything! \Box

HEALTH:

All the participants coming from the EU should bring their European Health Card. They can use the free European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) to allow you access to public hospital treatment. Please be aware that the EHIC is NOT a travel insurance policy, it will not cover private health care, non-emergency health costs, or being flown back to your home country.



We highly recommend you to make a health & travel insurance for the full duration of your time in Italy.

If you have any allergies or you need to take regular medications, please arrange these things by yourself as we are unable to provide them for you. Likewise, if you have any health conditions, disabilities or mobility issues that you feel we need to be aware of or that may affect your participation in the youth exchanges activities, then please let us know what they are and how best to assist you.

ANTI-CONTAMINATION SAFETY DEVICES.

The association Maison du Monde will provide participants with anti-contagious safety devices from Covid-19, such as masks, sanitizing gels and body temperature meter. All environments where activities will take place will be sanitized. Everything to guarantee the development of the project in full safety and in compliance with current regulations regarding the Covid-19 situation.
